FALSE: Social Security Benefits Will be Paid On Time and Other Updates Related to the COVID-19 Pandemic	Andrew Saul, Commissioner of Social Security, reminds the public that Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefit payments will continue to be paid on time during the COVID-19 pandemic. The agency also reminds everyone to be aware of scammers who try to take advantage of the pandemic to trick people into providing personal information or payment via retail gift cards, wire transfers, internet currency, or by mailing cash, to maintain Social Security benefit payments or receive economic impact payments from the Department of the Treasury. FALSE: Municipal Courts in Las Cruces are closed	The Las Cruces Municipal Court is instituting a temporary policy to reduce the possible risk of COVID-19 exposure to the public and Court employees. The New Mexico Department of Public Health issued emergency public health orders to include mandatory closures and guidelines to stem the spread of COVID-19 in New Mexico. Courts are exempt from the public health orders, as they are an independent branch of the government, and are responsible for providing essential public safety services, maintaining the rule of law, and ensuring that the constitutional rights of defendants are protected. The public seeking access to Las Cruces Municipal Court will be screened at the main entrance to the Court.
